With reference to the above meeting, the undersigned has suggested the following to the perusal of the Chairman for incorporation in the minutes of the 2nd SAC meeting:

- 1. In the tariff proposal for the year 2016-17, the Commission has recommended under LT-I(B) in the Domestic slab of 201 to 400 as proposed a steep increase of Rs.4.80 to 8.15 per unit, which is very high. It may be revised in the final tariff proposal.
- 2. The tariff proposal under LT-II of non-domestic category, the Commission has proposed a separate tariff for the "Hair Cutting Saloon", while there is no separate tariff proposal for Educational Institutions. In the Telangana State, all the districts are treated as educationally backward both in the primary and higher education by the Planning Commission. Further many of the industries are giving separate tariff / tax exemption for the educational institutions. Therefore, it is suggested for a separate tariff proposal for the primary and higher education institutions located in Telangana State.
- 3. The Regulatory Commission may also propose a separate tariff for the domestic slabs for the residential areas in the rural areas so as to encourage the rural population.
- 4. The Telangana State is mostly depending upon the thermal power for the electricity supply which is mainly based on the coal mines. Every year the coal mines have been extensively digging for the supply of coal for thermal power station. Due to the environmental issues, there may be any time possibility of arising legal problems for digging the coal. Therefore, TSERC may recommend an alternative resource especially for nuclear power. In this regard the TSERC may constitute a Research Committee to look into the alternative sources of the power supply like nuclear and solar energy with regard to their qualitative, quantitative, safety and financial matters. The Research Committee may submit its recommendations to the TSERC.
